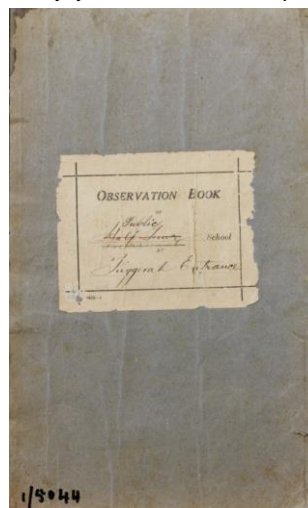

School History

Every year or two the inspector would do a formal visit and make comments on: Attendance, the number of Boys and Girls enrolled and present on the day; Organisation, a description of the school buildings and grounds; Discipline; and finally Instruction.

The first inspection took place on 20.9.16. by Donald E Fraser. In the visitors' book he recorded that there were 17 present.

In the Observation Book he wrote under Organisation: *The school is a modern structure, recently erected.*



The grounds are not fenced. Both outhouses are clean. No litter lies about the grounds. A few bright pictures adorn the walls. Classification of pupils is satisfactory. Close attention is given to the matter of reformation (??). Every school should have the assistance of a Parents' and Citizens' Association. Months ago I recommended the changing of both H.T. School into full-time Schools,

Discipline: The children are clean, quiet, orderly & well behaved. They are cheerful and industrious. The Physical Training and Junior Cadet Training are very satisfactory. Most of the pupils had never attended school, before the opening of the school 16.11.15, and so Mr Dagg has had an unusually difficult task. The general progress is creditable save in Mathematics.

Instruction:

English

Owing to their want of educational facilities, the pupils have only a tolerable general information. Good progress has been made in Reading, Writing, Spelling and Poetry. When funds are available, a small library should be established in order to develop the sadly neglected taste for Decent Reading.

Mathematics

The Number work is very disappointing, the four fundamental operations must be taught at one time, with persistence. Make special study of the admirable Syllabus Notes.

Nature

The elementary Geography is handled intelligently. Nature Study is mostly am ??? of pupils, direct observations, the right attitude is being secured. Pupils have made a small but interesting collection of Natural History Specimens

Preschool Enrolments for 2016

If you have a child who will be turning four years old before the 31st July 2016 and you would like to enrol them in our preschool for next year, please collect an application form from the front office. There are only 40 places available. The preschool currently operates two groups; one operating every Monday and Tuesday and alternate Wednesdays, the other operating Thursdays and Fridays and the alternate Wednesdays.

Priority must go to children who live in The Entrance Public School area and will be attending kindergarten at The Entrance Public School in 2017. Preference must also be given to students who have a disability, come from a low socio-economic family situation and/or are of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander descent. A birth certificate is also required for proof of age.

The Garawa Pre-school is run by the Department of Education and Communities and fees have been heavily subsidised to cater for the needs of our community. This year the full fee rate per day is \$15 per day. If the family has a Health Care card or are Aboriginal, fee relief is applied and the cost is reduced to \$7.00 per day. To date fees have not been given to us for 2016.

We are currently making plans for our Kindergarten Transition to School program for students starting in 2015, which will commence today **Wednesday 14th October at 2-3pm**. If you have a child or know of a child that may be starting at The Entrance Public School in 2015 could you please advise the office to assist us with planning for the transition program and enrolment at the best school on the Central Coast.

2016 Year 6 School Shirts

AVID Training

At various points across this Term our Stage 3 teachers will be attending training courses in AVID. This year at TEPS all of our Stage 3 classes have implemented AVID (Advancement Via Individual Determination) and it has helped to shape how our students are learning and in addition to this is preparing them well for their transitioning to high school. AVID is not just a 'school thing' but helps students develop success skills for life. At TEPS we have already had a number of other schools from all over the TLLC (Tuggerah Lakes Learning Community) and even from the Northern Territory come to see what we are doing here at TEPS.

Stage 3 Awards

This Term will see Stage 3 launch five new awards that students can aspire to achieve. Each week Stage 3 teachers will nominate candidates to receive awards and at the Stage Wellbeing meeting held each Friday morning teachers will corporately decide who is the overall recipient in each award category.

These awards are the highest awards that students can receive in Stage 3. No student is entitled to receive these awards only those students who have rigorously worked hard to achieve them.
