

## Principal's report

### Tell Them From Me Survey

This term, our school, like many other public schools in the state, will participate in a Department of Education initiative: the Tell Them From Me student feedback survey. The survey measures factors that are known to affect academic achievement and other student outcomes. The focus of the NSW-wide survey is on student wellbeing, engagement and effective teaching practices. More information about the survey is available at: <http://surveys.cese.nsw.gov.au>

The survey is a great opportunity for our students to provide us with valuable and quick feedback on what they think about school life, how engaged they are with school and the different ways that teachers interact with them. More than 6,300 schools in Australia and around the world have used Tell Them From Me to survey 5.4 million students. Capturing the voices of our students will help improve how we do things at our school. I want to assure you that the survey is confidential. The survey is conducted online and will typically take less than 30 minutes to complete. It will be administered during school hours to students Years 4 – 6 between 20 March and 12 April. Participating in the survey is entirely voluntary. A consent form and FAQs for parents/carers about the survey was sent home with students last week.

### National day of Action against bullying and violence



On Friday 15 March 2019, The Entrance Public School joined with 5726 Australian schools as part of a nationwide movement. School communities across the nation shared one message 'Bullying. No Way!' to mark the 9<sup>th</sup> National Day of Action against Bullying and Violence. Across the school day, I was so pleased to see every student and every teacher participating in lessons, activities and events around this year's theme of Bullying. No Way! Take action every day. I visited classrooms and saw students engaged in a wide range of activities such as art, poster design, persuasive writing, research, drama and role play. Well done, TEPS! The National Day of Action (NDA) is an important opportunity for schools to take action and empower young people to be part of the solution when addressing bullying in their school community. It provides an opportunity

to focus on bullying and the changes we can all make to help create safer communities for everyone.

Thank you to our TEPS students who joined with over 2.4 million students around Australia who are driving action in their school communities. Let's take a stand together every day to say Bullying. No Way!

### COMMUNITY CONCERNS ABOUT "MOMO"

There have been some recent news reports about "Momo," a current viral concern based on a disturbing looking character with bulging eyes. This character allegedly attempts to entice children to try various "challenges" that may have unsafe or dangerous consequences. These claims appear to be exaggerated, with little or no evidence of truth. Whilst there are various credible reports across the world which confirm "The Momo challenge" is simply a hoax, we recognise that the image of Momo alone may cause anxiety for children and parents. Our teaching staff are aware of this issue. Students who feel curious about Momo may have searched online for images and may feel disturbed or upset by the image they find. It is important to communicate to children that simply viewing this image has no effect (other than possibly upsetting a child). It does not activate any social interaction via email, text or app. We encourage our TEPS parents to talk to their children about best ways to manage an online situation where they may feel threatened or encouraged by others to participate in unsafe or potentially harmful behaviour. In any such circumstance, parents must report this behaviour to the Office of the eSafety Commissioner: <https://www.esafety.gov.au>

In an effort to protect and support our students, we encourage parents to actively monitor their child's social online behaviour. We remind our families that the minimum age is 13 for Facebook, Youtube, Instagram and Snapchat, in compliance with Children's Online Privacy Protection Act (COPPA). We read the story 'Have You Filled a Bucket Today' and discussed ways we can all be bucket fillers. Have a read of these wonderful pieces of writing about 'Bullying' from our Stage One Students.

### Bullying. No Way! By Ilana 1/2K

A good friend is someone that uses nice words and asks a friend "Do you want to play with me?" A good friend is someone that says "Do you need help?" A good friend is someone that shares.

### Bullying. No Way! By Juliette 1/2K

A good friend is kind and helpful. When you help someone they are nice back. Tell a teacher when someone gets bullied.

## Stage 3 News

Dear Parents/ Caregivers,

The first excursion for Stage 3 is now complete! We know that your children would now have a much deeper understanding of Aboriginal cultures and perspectives because of this experience. As mentioned earlier this year, we are aiming to have one excursion/activity a term as this is not a camp year for Stage 3.



The *National Day of Action Against Bullying and Violence* was last Friday (15th March 2019). All Stage 3 classes participated in activities based on how to stop bullying and what students can do about it. More information can be found on the website: <https://bullyingnoway.gov.au/>.

Continuing on with this, Mr Nguyen has kindly signed Stage 3 up for a *Bouncing Back from Online Bullying* webinar. Each session is a guided experience to **empower students to build personal skills** to help them recover from negative online experiences. The session will address general capabilities for **Information and Communication Technology**, and **Civics and Citizenship**, including:

- Explore ways to maximise their own and others' safety in a digital environment
- Examine the implications of ICT in establishing and maintaining respectful relationships
- Explore safe upstander and pro-social behaviours in relation to addressing bullying and forms of discrimination in various social and online environments.

Year 5's session was on Tuesday 19th March and Year 6's session will be on Thursday 21st March. It is important for all students to feel safe in our learning environments. Please do not hesitate to contact your child's teacher if you believe they are being bullied.

## \$100 VOUCHER FOR CHILDREN'S SPORT AND FITNESS FEES

Parents in NSW can again claim \$100 towards extra-curricular sport and other physical activity fees in 2019 thanks to the NSW Government's Active Kids program. This program provides a \$100 voucher for parents to put towards sporting fees and registration costs for each school-aged child in NSW.

Families can use the voucher for registration and membership costs, as well as fees for activities such as swimming and dance. The annual voucher will not be means tested because the NSW Government wants every child from every family to get active and involved in community sport and fitness.

The health of our children is a priority for the NSW Government, and it is hoped that this makes a difference in enabling you to enrol your child in the sport or physical activity of your choice.


