
Permission to Publish

Central Coast Primary Schools' Public Speaking Competition 2023

Dear Parents and Carers,

Students from TEPS will be provided the opportunity to participate in the Central Coast Primary Schools' Public Speaking Competition. Students from Kindergarten to Year 6 will present speeches in year groups and winners will represent TEPS against other schools in Round 1 of the interschool competition. Speeches will be held at school in Week 4, Monday August 7 – Thursday August 10, 2023.

This competition forms a part of the Talking and Listening component of the English syllabus. ALL students are required to present a speech to their class in Week 4. The speeches will be assessed by class teachers and stage assistant principal.

Students are to select a topic from the list below or a topic of personal interest. Speeches will be judged according to the criteria outlined below. This rubric may help your child when preparing for their speech.

The Waterhole

Our Thirsty? Choose Water! Program, in partnership with the Central Coast Learning Health Department, is coming together nicely.

The Aboriginal Artwork titled, 'The Waterhole' by artist Jakeob Watson, was cleverly printed onto an adhesive wrap and placed onto the wall surrounding our Chilled Water Station, by Rick from Bannerama at Long Jetty.

'The Waterhole' represents traditional significance amongst our First Nation Peoples and was chosen to surround our Chilled Water Station for this reason. Over the next few weeks, all students will learn about the importance of the waterhole for Aboriginal People's survival and design their own waterhole artwork.

Stage 2 students will be participating in a 'Thirsty? Choose Water! Day in Week 5 on Friday the 18th of August, that will involve rotational learning activities that highlight the important health benefits associated with choosing water as the preferred choice for hydration.




